



Documentary film fest from Nov 28 in City

BANGALORE, Nov 26 (DHNS)

In an attempt to bring documentary films closer to Bangaloreans, the People's Film Festival is all set to screen 15 documentary films free, from November 28 to December 1 at the Alliance Francaise on Thimmaiah Road here.

Addressing a press conference today, Dr Parvez Imam, Convenor of PFF, said the second edition of the film festival, titled 'PFF Bangalore South Asia 2001', will screen select documentaries on South Asia, chiefly made by French and South Asian filmmakers apart from showcasing a selection of films produced by students within Bangalore.

'King for a day', 'The secret of the temples of Angkor' and 'Scars of war' are some of the films on the agenda of the four-day event, sponsored by Svez and OpusCMD.

The festival will also include panel discussions on topics such as "Challenges for documentary-the state and the market", "Sharing a documentary-some experiences", "Documentary films- a voice for the marginalised" and "Docume-ntary film making-form vs content".

The panelists will include filmmakers, media personalities and social activists, prominent among whom are Vinod Raja, Challam Benurkar and Nalini Ramanna.

The show and panel discussion timings will be between 6 pm and 9:30 pm on Nov 28, 29; 5 pm and 9:30 pm on Nov 30; 3:30 pm and 9:30 pm on December 1. For further details, contact Alliance Francaise at 2258762 / 2265390.
